

## Community Care Services Early Intervention Program...

provides quality mental health services and other Early On Program services to families with children under three years old who have special needs including:

- an established medical condition or
- a developmental delay

The Early Intervention Program works in collaboration with the Departments of Education and Community Health, the Family Independence Agency and other private agencies and organizations.

### Early On Michigan was ...

created in response to the enactment of Public Law 99-457, which entitles families with children under the age of three, with special needs, to receive early intervention services.

### Community Care Services ...

provides comprehensive mental health and substance abuse services to children, adults and families from Allen Park, Belleville, Ecorse, Lincoln Park, Melvindale, River Rouge, Romulus, Taylor, Huron, Sumpter and Van Buren Townships and Southwest Detroit.

## A Wide Range of Services...

### ▪ Service Coordination

A Service Coordinator connects families with community resources to meet their specific needs.

### ▪ Parent Advocacy

Parents receive one-on-one support and guidance from an experienced Parent Advocate.

### ▪ Parent Support Groups

Parents meet to share feelings, experiences and information and to provide affirmation.

### ▪ Parenting Skills Group

Parents increase parenting skills with guidance of a Mental Health Therapist.

### ▪ In-Home Mental Health Services

Mental Health Therapists provide direct services to families in their own homes.

### ▪ Partners Through Play

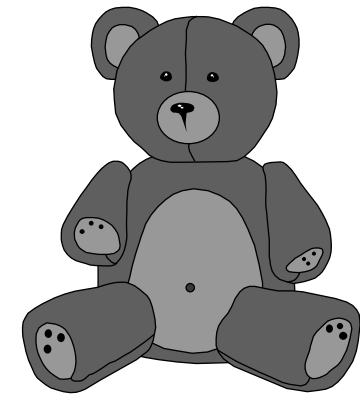
Parents with children 1-2 years old meet weekly to discuss parenting and to spend time playing with their children.

### ▪ Children's Socialization Group

Children ages 2-3 meet weekly to practice appropriate social skills.

### ▪ Lekotek

Families meet with a Lekotek leader to learn play activities. Families may borrow up to six toys to use at home.
